



JIM TAYLOR, TFDA CONVENTION CHAPLAIN

Jim Taylor has been on staff at Williamson Memorial Funeral Home & Cremation Services for more than 30 years, serving in various capacities including as house chaplain.

But his role at both the Franklin and Spring Hill locations for Williamson Memorial goes beyond just having a career. It's a true calling.

"This is so much more than just a paycheck for me," said Taylor, also known as Jimbo to the many natives of Williamson County who know him. "This is truly a ministry in and of itself. I know so many

of the folks that come in our doors, and have had the opportunity to serve their grieving family in a time of need.

"I feel like the Lord can open doors that we can't shut and he can shut doors that we can't open, and I feel like he had his hand on me coming to work here."

That was in 1990, when Clyde Stephens hired him to work at what was then Franklin Memorial Chapel and later Williamson Memorial. Taylor, who graduated in the 1970s from David Lipscomb College with a bachelor's degree in Bible and speech, went through a two-year apprenticeship and took a state board exam to get his license as a funeral director after Stephens brought him aboard.

As house chaplain for Williamson Memorial in both Franklin and Spring Hill, Taylor has officiated more than 2,300 funerals. He said that quite often he will take families out to area churches for funeral services or take them to some of the rural cemeteries for graveside services.

"We do several funerals a year and he preaches probably 40% of them, if not more," said Pam Stephens, Clyde Stephens' daughter who is also a funeral director at Williamson Memorial. "He started out as an ambulance driver back in the days when ambulances were located in the funeral homes.

"Now he does a little bit of everything, and he loves what he does. Jim has been an asset not only for the families we serve here, but for the whole community. He is loved by so many."

Though he didn't officially become a licensed funeral director until the early 1990s, Taylor felt long before that he would land in a service position in which he offered comfort and caring for many families. He worked part-time at the funeral home as a high school student.

"As a teen, I went to school in the morning, worked in the funeral home in the afternoon, and ran ambulance cars at night," said Taylor, who turns 70 today, May 18.



When he's not in his role as funeral director and chaplain, Taylor enjoys his family and his hobbies. He and his wife, Dawn, have raised three children in Franklin.

And like many in Williamson County, Taylor holds a deep interest in Civil War history. His great-great-grandfather fought in the Battle of Franklin, and he can look out from the Williamson Memorial parking lot and see where the Nov. 30, 1864, skirmish got underway on Winstead Hill.

"I have a huge interest in Civil War history here in town, and that's probably what generated a lot of that interest," Taylor said of the proximity to the battle site and his ancestral lineage.

He's also an avid golfer and enjoys gardening as well.

When it comes to his place of employment over the past 33 years, Taylor has witnessed firsthand the impact that Williamson Memorial Funeral Home & Cremation Services has had on countless families in the area.

"I think folks here in Franklin and Williamson County take a lot of pride in knowing that for years our funeral home was owned and operated by a family. Clyde Stephens knew everybody in town, so he built this relationship, this rapport, with so many families, and they trusted him, especially with their loved one in the time of need.

"So I think Franklin residents have considered Williamson Memorial and later Spring Hill as their home funeral home. It is such an honor for us to be trusted by loved ones and to serve them."

MIKE KEITH, "VOICE OF THE TITANS"

Mike Keith starts his 27th season with the Tennessee Titans, his 26th as "The Voice of the Titans".

Describing one legendary NFL play on January 8, 2000 put him on the map. Mike accurately and enthusiastically called the play that he later dubbed as "The Music City Miracle", a last-second touchdown that gave the Tennessee Titans a playoff win over the Buffalo Bills. ESPN named Mike's description of "The Music City Miracle" as one of the 10 Best Radio Calls in American Sports History.

With that signature call and scores more since 1999, Mike earned a spot on the "Top 100 Local Voices in the first 100 Years of Sports Broadcasting" list by Sports Broadcast Journal in 2021.

Along with being named Tennessee's Sportscaster of the Year twelve times and winning 20+ Associated Press awards, Mike owns a 1997 Edward R. Murrow Award for nationwide excellence in reporting. Mike is a member of five Halls of Fame, including the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, Tennessee Radio Hall of Fame, TSSAA Hall of Fame, BGA Hall of Fame and University of Tennessee Baseball Hall of Fame.

Outside of calling play-by-play on Sundays, Mike hosts multiple Titans Radio shows during game week, hosts The Mike Vrabel Show, Titans All Access and Titans Gameday television programs, and moderates the official Titans podcast known as The OTP. Mike has also called the Reese's Senior Bowl and hosted shows on Sirius XM NFL Radio, has done play-by-play work for both ESPN and the SEC Network and is the special announcer for "Paddle Royale", a ping-pong tournament that highlights Country Radio Seminar week annually. Yes, he calls ping-ping and has even called paintball. Ask Mike about it!

Two passions are calling Tennessee high school state championship events in various sports for the TSSAA and working with talented young broadcasters to help them develop their broadcasting craft. Teaching might have become Mike's truest love, as he started his broadcasting career while in high school at BGA, working at WAGG-TV in Franklin. Mike likes to share with broadcasting students that he "made a ton of mistakes and had a lot of help along the way."

Mike became the WUTK's sports director on his third day on campus in Knoxville in 1986. Within just months of that appointment, at only 19, Mike was hired by the legendary John Ward with the Vol Radio Network. He would work in a variety of roles with the Vol Network from 1987-98, including being "The Voice of the Baseball Vols" from 1992-98. His love of college baseball is well-known, and the Titans certainly understand, having allowed ESPN to hire Mike to call NCAA Regionals in 2015, 2016 and 2018.

Mike also hosted one of Tennessee's first daily sports talk shows from 1989-98 for WIVK/WNOX Radio in Knox-ville. His four-hour show was named Tennessee's best in five of the first six years that awards were presented in AP's sports talk show category in 1990's. Mike still makes weekly appearances on over ten different sports talk shows throughout the region during football season and he enjoys each.

Born in Knoxville and raised in Franklin, Mike and his wife, Michelle, have two children, Abby, and Matthew.
